

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

The NRMP Match for Dermatopathology Fellowship

The selection process for prospective fellows in Dermatopathology has switched to the NRMP Pathology Fellowship Match **for positions that begin in 2028**. Dermatopathology will participate in a multi-specialty Pathology Fellowship Match with Molecular Pathology, Hematopathology, Forensic Pathology, and Cytopathology, the subspecialties in surgical pathology that have also decided to implement match for recruitment.

When should one apply for the 2028-29 fellowship positions?	Applications are encouraged to be submitted to programs participating in match before January 15, 2027. Note that one can start applying for positions before registering for the NRMP Match.
How will fellowship applications be handled?	The ASDP is partnering with FellowshipsCAS (insert hyperlink) to provide a centralized, low-cost application platform. Participating programs will be listed on the ASDP fellowship program website along with a link to the application service.
When should interviews begin?	Programs participating in the match are free to begin interviewing when it works best for them; most programs will not start interviewing before January 2027.
When should programs and applicants register for the MRNP match?	Programs and applicants can make an account starting February 3, 2027, at noon, ET. Creation of the account constitutes a legally binding Match participation agreement.
When can programs and applicants enter their rank list?	Ranking opens on March 10, 2027, at noon, EST.
When is the deadline to make changes in the number of fellowship positions and/or to withdraw from the match?	The deadline is March 31, 2027, at noon, EST.
When can we no longer add to or modify a rank list?	Ranking certification must be completed by April 14, 2027, at noon, EST
When is Match Day?	Match day is April 28, 2027, at noon, EST.

<p>How does our program make an account with the NRMP and register for the Match?</p>	<p>All programs will receive an email from NRMP with directions on registering for the match. Your institutional official (IO) will also receive notification.</p>
<p>May a program ask an applicant to disclose their interest in their program in terms of ranking preference?</p>	<p>Programs are not permitted to request ranking preference from applicants. Programs and applicants may <u>voluntarily</u> disclose ranking preference or interest to programs without been asked.</p>
<p>May an applicant ask a program to disclose their interest in terms of ranking preference?</p>	<p>Applicants must not request the program's ranking preference or intentions. Programs may <u>voluntarily</u> disclose their ranking preference during the application/interview process</p>
<p>What if an applicant who matched at our program does not want to, or cannot enroll?</p>	<p>All programs and applicants must respect the binding nature of a match commitment and be prepared to honor the commitment if a match occurs with any program placed on a rank order list. If an applicant cannot, or will not honor the commitment, a waiver or deferral must be requested from the NRMP. Waivers are granted only in case of ineligibility, change of specialty, or anticipated, serious, and extreme hardship.</p>
<p>Do we have to include all our fellowship positions in the match?</p>	<p>No. We have not yet voted to use the "all-in" policy that would require this. Your program may have some match and some non-match positions.</p>
<p>If I have an internal applicant who I want to recruit to my fellowship, can I offer a position outside the match?</p>	<p>No. To maintain the integrity of the match process, programs with an internal applicant should still register for it. The program should interview and rank the internal applicant as #1 in their match list. They may freely disclose this to applicants, but it is a violation of the match agreement to ask applicants where they are ranking the program.</p>
<p>What happens if our program commits a match violation?</p>	<p>Match violations are investigated by the NRMP and serious consequences can</p>

	<p>occur. This can include being reported to relevant entities and being barred from future matches. NRMP violation policy section 6b: https://www.nrmp.org/policy/violations-policy/</p>

What if our fellowship program does not fill all the positions?	<p>After match day, all programs in the match with unfilled positions receive a list of applicants who did not match. Applicants also receive a list of unfilled programs. At this point, applicants can reach out directly to those programs to apply for an interview at these unfilled positions outside the NRMP Match.</p>

What are the benefits of using the NRMP match?	<p>It ensures that professional standards in conduct are used in the selection of fellows. The match will help make the dermatopathology fellowship selection process more equitable and timelier.</p>

<p>Where can I find a list of dermatopathology fellowship programs participating in the match?</p>	<p>ASDP will keep updated information regarding the NRMP match process, including a list of participating programs at their website</p>
<p>How much does it cost for programs to register with the NRMP Match?</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The Institution registration fee will be \$300 per Match. Because the Institution fee is per Match, if your institution already has a program participating in the Match, there will be no additional institution registration fee for your participation. 2. The Program registration fee will be \$100 per program track. 3. <p>What do I tell an applicant who applies for a position in my program?</p>	<p>There is a FAQ document written specifically for applicants that is posted on the ASDP website.</p>

<p>When will applicants be able to apply to non-Match programs?</p>	<p>Applicants can still apply to and interview at non-Match programs. However, they must decide whether to accept a position at a non-Match program before certification within the Match (before April 14, 2027). The Match is a binding commitment. If an applicant accepts a position at a non-Match program and does not withdraw from the NRMP Match, they will have committed a Match violation that may be disclosed to the medical school, current program director,</p>

	designated institutional official, and other relevant parties.
